The Queensland Regional Art Awards (QRAA) is Flying Arts' signature annual art awards for established and emerging artists living in regional and remote Queensland. The award aims to showcase artwork whilst providing a platform for artists to further professional development and opportunities.

In 2024, this much-anticipated annual signature event will open for entries on 1 July 2024 with a record prize pool of over \$140,000+ across 10 award categories, making the awards one of the most valuable art awards in Australia for regional artists, offering substantial non-acquisitive cash prizes together with in-kind prizes. The in-kind prizes include residencies and solo exhibition opportunities giving Queensland regional artists valuable avenues to engage in professional development.

Each year, the QRAA feature diverse visual arts categories responding to a selected theme. The theme for 2024 will be revealed early in 2024.

The Ekphrasis Challenge 2024:

A co-production of Flying Arts and Queensland Poetry Festival (QPF), the QRAA Ekphrasis Challenge asks poets Australia-wide to repond to the winning artworks in the Queensland Regional Art Awards in 2024.


