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2018 PROGRAM DEVELOPMENTS



It's full of diverse personalities, local legends and hidden gems valued by tourists and locals alike. This year, artists are asked to embrace a spirit of adventure to discover something unique about their own community or one that they visit within the state.



This opportunity allows the school to work collaboratively with an experienced Flying Arts artist or art teacher to plan and deliver a visual



Applications will be assessed on alignment with curriculum, engagement, distance from a metropolitan centre, justification of proposal, creativity of the proposed idea and ongoing impact.
