2025 QUEENSLAND REGIONAL ART AWARDS

The Queensland Regional Art Awards (QRAA) is Flying Arts' signature annual art awards for established and emerging artists living in regional, rural and remote Queensland. The award aims to showcase artwork whilst providing a platform for artists to further professional development and opportunities. Each year, the QRAA features diverse visual arts categories responding to a selected theme.

This much-anticipated award will open for entries on 1 August 2024 across 10 award categories, making the awards one of the most valuable art awards in Australia for regional artists, offering substantial non-acquisitive cash prizes together with in-kind prizes. The in-kind prizes include residencies and solo exhibition opportunities giving Queensland regional artists valuable avenues to engage in professional development and broaden audience reach.

Flying Arts organises a co-event, the QRAA Ekphrasis Challenge, which asks poets to respond to the winning artworks in the Queensland Regional Art Awards in 2024. The poems will be displayed as part of the touring exhibition of the 2024 QRAA.

Paul was inspired by these stories and incorporates them with traditional designs and modern techniques in his paintings and printmaking.

Paul recently won the First Nations prize in the Queensland Regional Art Awards.
